Roads and Bridges

- Annual maintenance at sustainable levels
- Shifting priorities from maintenance to rehabilitation and hard surfacing gravel roads
- New program for rehabilitation of hard surfaced roads that are in poor or very poor condition

 - 1-2 properties in Malahide per year
- Revitalization and Beautification Plans
 - TransCanada Trail amenities
 - Springfield parks
 - Copenhagen park



Economic Development Cont'd

Other Initiatives:

- Port Bruce beach clean up added as a permanent annual commitment
- Partnering with County for marketing of Hacienda Road industrial property (20 acres)
- Promotional materials, banners, and advertising included to promote tourism and events

Economic Development Cont'd

- Availability of building lots
 - Limited availability; official plan to be reviewed
- Servicing to growth areas (water/sewer)
 - Needed but not included in the 2018 Budget
- Co-op Student for 8 months
 - Needed to support Building Department with documenting old files, job-shadow, assist with plan review

- Cultivating Malahide (ICSP) Update
- Official Plan Update (over 2 years)
- Road Safety Audit (year 3 of 4)

- New Fire Hall ->training equipment
- Storage Bldg. to store emergency management trailer and fire safety house
- Springfield Beautification

- Gravel Road Conversion Century Line
- Road Rehabilitation Conservation Line and Glencolin Line

COUNCIL DIRECTION REQUIRED

- Integrated Community Sustainability Plan renewal over two years \$15,000 each year
- Ice management/dredging reserve not used in 2017 – utilize in 2018 – \$13,000
- Use of prior year Surplus to offset Property Tax Levy – \$39,232



COUNCIL DIRECTION REQUIRED

- Use of Building Department Reserve to fund Official Plan update – \$30,000
- Municipal Drains reduce current year allocation up to \$25,000
- Waste Management Fee shift burden off farmland: increase to \$30 per household and reduce tax levy by \$36,000

COUNCIL DIRECTION REQUIRED

- Asset Management Plan (AMP) use OCIF funds to finance \$12,500 (Note: Staff will be applying for a grant)
- Capital Rehabilitation Program no impact on tax levy
